
CREATURE PUPPETS

Here's how you

can make your own
hand puppet that looks like
a mythical creature!

1.

Lay your hand down flat on one of the sheets of felt with your fingers spread out. Draw around the shape of your hand and wrist, leaving about a 3cm gap. Don't go in between fingers. See the rough shape you should be aiming for below.



Cut out this shape and lay it on top of another piece of felt. Draw around it and then cut it out. You now should have two pieces that are the same. *****

Lay them down flat on top of each other and sew them together around the edges. Leave the bottom clear as this is where your hand will go in. You can do quite big stitches here!

Now you're ready to turn your puppet in to a creature! Would you like it to be scary or cute? Or would you like it to look like an animal or monster?



First cut out some eyes out of another colour felt, and then perhaps some pupils to stick on top? Use the glue stick to stick pieces together and to stick them to your puppet.

Think about it being a bit like collaging with paper!

Now create the mouth, nose, hands, or whatever features you would like your creature to have by cutting out pieces of felt and sticking them to the puppet.

You could even add some wool for the hair – you could do this by bunching it together and sewing it on.

Once you've added all your features you could add in any final details with you needle and thread. Eyelashes? Nostrils? Eyebrows?
